<u>Welcome GATORS</u>: We want to welcome all of our returning and new Gator parents & guardians to a new school year! We hope you all enjoyed the fantastic Okanagan sunshine this summer and are ready for a new year at NGE. We are piloting a new format for our Newsletter this year. We do encourage parents to keep informed by regularly reading our newsletters.

Our school will aim to send the newsletter each month to coincide with the upcoming PAC meeting dates. We also encourage you to connect with your child's classroom teacher for specific details regarding your individual learners at any time throughout the year.

This year we are welcoming 136 families to NGE (75 new Kindergarten students and over 60 new students in grade 1-6). Our current student enrollment is 630 students. We had anticipated our enrollment to be even higher, but we had several families move to other cities over the summer. That said, our school had to re-organize during the 1st week into 27 divisions instead of 28. Our teaching team and support team went above and beyond to look at every individual student's placement. We are confident that every NGE student has been placed in a learning situation that will support their individual learning, growth and success.

We have also introduced a 4th R...Resiliency: encouraging students to build their strategies and capacity to work through challenges with the support of our amazing NGE community.

Student Verification Forms

Verification forms are being delivered this week on YELLOW paper. Thank you parents for reading these carefully, making any edits/changes and **returning them to your child's teachers as soon as possible**. These forms must be filled out at the beginning of each year for **every** child in order to confirm or provide new contact information. If this information should change throughout the school year, please contact the office to update. Please send the forms back as soon as you can.

Accident Insurance

Central Okanagan Public Schools does not insure expenses for <u>student injuries</u> that occur on school grounds or during school activities. Parents and guardians can voluntarily purchase private accident insurance. The Kids Plus Accident Insurance Program that was previously offered to our students was discontinued in 2019. The IA Financial Group now offers the Family Accident Reimbursement Plan (FARP) which is a voluntary plan that provides coverage for students and their families against accidental injury, unexpected medical expenses, and critical illness.

Appeals Procedures: The Central Okanagan School District's Appeals Process

Board Policy 460 – Appeals states that, "A student or a parent of a student who is entitled to an educational program in the Central Okanagan Public Schools may appeal a decision of an employee of the Board of Education which significantly affects the education, health or safety of the student". The Central Okanagan School District's Financial Hardship Clause

Within Board Regulation 425R - Student Fees (see www.sd23.bc.ca), the Board of Education has

indicated "that a student will not be excluded from any educational program due to financial hardship". Clause 8.5 in the Regulations states "Principals are directed to establish a procedure in each school which will allow for the private and confidential consideration of financial circumstances of individual students and families. Such procedures will preserve the dignity of families who may be unable to pay". Please contact Sue Stevenson, NGE Principal, if you are facing a financial hardship that may restrict the ability of your child to access a school program.

<u>From the office:</u> Reminder to parents to please bring in any missing documentation as soon as possible. We will reach out to parents to request missing registration and / or medical information as we review intake files. It is a Ministry of Education requirement that we have all legal documents on file in a timely manner.

<u>Medical Cautions</u> - Please connect with office clerk Leah Andersen in the main office regarding any updates or changes to current medical information for your child. Please deliver medications your child MAY require to the office ASAP.

<u>Volunteering</u> - Forms are available to be picked up at the main office. As per school board policy, all volunteers in our school MUST complete a Criminal record check which is valid for 4 years.

<u>Student Fees</u> - collection temporarily suspended as per Ministry of Education support.

Office hours - Thank you for utilizing the district automated synervoice system to report student absenteeism promptly in the morning. Our office is open from 8:00 am until 3:00. At 250-870-5128. The office is unable to manage inquiries or messages regarding changes of plans and appointments. Please work with your child and his/her teacher to have these arrangements made and confirmed prior to arriving on site. The office is always available to help in an emergency.
