#### **PARKING AT OUR SCHOOLS**





Vehicle parking and stopping habits can create hazards putting students at increased risk of injury.

In an effort to decrease the risk to our students, you are being asked to follow some basic parking/stopping rules. Parking restrictions and marked areas on the roads are there for a reason - to keep children safe.

The preferred option when dropping off or picking up your children is to park away from the site and take a short walk to the gates.

If you must park near to the school and space is limited, please follow the <u>rules</u>.

- Do NOT park within 5 meters of driveways.
- Do NOT park across dropped curbs or driveways.
- Do NOT double park.
- Do NOT park on footpaths.
- Do NOT stop to drop kids off in the center of the road.
- DO NOT LEAVE CAR UNATTEND IN THE KISS AND DROP area!
- DO NOT do a U-turn in the middle of Snowsell!
- Always abide by the restriction signs
  - -only park in permitted areas.
- PLEASE park safely and be considerate of children, parents and residents by not causing an obstruction.

- Students should not play close to the parking lot.

#### **School Dress Code**

With the warmer weather approaching, North Glenmore Staff would like to remind our students of our school dress code which is part of our Code of Conduct. We

request that students come to school wearing clothing that is clean & suitable for school. Clothing or temporary tattoos featuring violent or offensive pictures or words or promoting alcohol/drug use are inappropriate for a positive elementary school learning environment. 'Beach wear' (eg. bathing suits) are not appropriate. (NOTE: Students may be asked to change or cover up). Hats should be removed when indoors. Please use foot wear that is suitable for playing outside (no high heels, sports cleats; although flip-flops and sandals may be fine for inside wear, footwear suitable for running and use on playground equipment is necessary for playing during lunch and recess).



Tick season will be upon us sooner than we know it. For tick prevention, pay special attention to your pets and yourself. When exploring the outdoors always cover yourself from head to toe, and wear light-colored clothing so you can spot ticks more easily if they do get on you. Search yourself thoroughly, particularly at the base of your skull, and wash your clothes immediately after returning home.
