


hockey players value education! Thank you Kelowna Rockets! You can see them pictured here with grade 4 students from the Acorn learning Community.

The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is coming to NGE in February! School District 23 has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The MDI is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of

children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

New City Park coming to the Glenmore Neighborhood

Senior NGE students were asked some questions about what features they would like to see in a new park that is being planned for our Glenmore neighbourhood in 2023. City planners met with several grade 5 & 6 NGE student representatives to hear their ideas. The Glenmore Recreation Park Master Plan is being revisited to ensure it best serves the current community and is responsive to trends and conditions that have occurred over time, and they want our feedback.

The schematic design is anticipated for completion in 2023 after public engagement, and construction is planned for 2024. Future amenities for Glenmore Recreation Park may include an artificial turf field, sport courts and a splash park.
