# Registration of New Students for September 2021

# School-Based Team Meetings: What are They? Why Do We Have them?

The purpose of a **School-Based Team Meeting** is an opportunity to discuss issues that arise for a student and, as a team, brainstorm solutions.

When the school observes academic, behavioural or social issues that continue to be a concern for a student, a decision is often made to schedule a School-Based Team meeting to further support that student. The parents are included as a part of the team and are invited to join the meeting whenever possible (parents are generally contacted by phone by the classroom teacher.) The school team consists of the classroom teacher, the Learning Assistance Teacher (who is usually the facilitator), one or two members of the school administration, the school counsellor and any other support services involved with the student, such as the Speech and Language Pathologist.

Our goal, as a team, is to help the student be more successful. Support strategies are identified and an Action Plan is developed. A further meeting may be scheduled to review the plan.

This is an important partnership and process that helps students understand that home and school are working together to support them in their education.

### Winter Reminders....

Parents please discuss these matters with your child(ren):

- 1. The "no snowball" rule is in effect. While throwing snow seems like a perfectly natural activity, the potential exists for injury to others. We continue to remind students that throwing snow at school, or to and from school may lead to suspension.
- 2. Students should be dressed warmly so they can fully participate in the fresh outdoors. It is a good idea to send along some extra clothing during the wet/ slushy season.

\*\*Please label your child's clothes\*\*

- 3. When the weather warms then returns to cold, we find a lot of ice on our fields! We continually caution students (and parents) to stay away from icy patches and walk along the cleared pathways.
- 4. During particularly icy days, use of the Adventure Playground equipment will be cancelled. A reminder that running on the Adventure Playground is NOT safe at any time and is not allowed.
- 6. Snow "tunnelling" is not allowed due to the possibility of "cave-ins."



### Winter Weather Is Here!!!

Slippery winter sidewalks create a hazard for children making their way to and from school.

This is one of the reasons that our local municipalities have bylaws and policies requiring residents to clear snow and ice from sidewalks, walkways, and stairways bordering their property after each snowfall. We would ask that all community members that live in areas where students travel to and from school be on the lookout for slip hazards, and help make the commute to school a safe one.







## **Traffic and Parking Reminders**

With a new year upon us, we'd like to remind everyone about some important traffic and parking reminders.

### **Traffic/Driving:**

- (1) Please be sure to drive 30km/hr when in our school zone and be aware of all pedestrians. Children sometimes forget the road safety rules and your diligence around the school is greatly appreciated.
- (2) When using our morning Kiss & Drop (i.e. Drop Zone), be sure to pull up to the end of the zone to let your child/children out of your vehicle. Please move forward in the zone as space becomes available.

#### Parking:

Both the upper and lower parking lots are **staff only**. With our significant increase in enrollment over the years, we now have more staff than parking spaces available. Parents can park all along Snowsell in areas that are marked for permitted parking.

# THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/FEBRUARY!

Central Okanagan Public Schools has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Year Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.

Grade 5 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between: February 1st and February 26th, 2021.

Online applications begin on Monday, February 1, 2021 at 7:00 am,
Schools will be open at 7:00 am to support parents that require assistance
Documentation Submission Deadline: Friday, March 12, 2021

### **HOW TO APPLY**

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Go directly to a school on February 1st or later to complete the online application.

Assistance will be provided.

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only, no paper enrollment is available. You are required to have a valid email account.

Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school either in person or by email by Friday, March 12, 2021.

- 1. Birth certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship
- 2. Proof of B.C. Residency
  - a. BC driver's license of parent/legal guardian AND
  - b. BC CARE card of parent/legal guardian OR
  - Other supporting documentation http://www.sd23.bc.ca/DistrictInfo/schoolenrollment/
- 3. Proof of Student's Living Address
  - a. Property ownership, lease or rental agreement OR recent utility bill

#### AFTER Thursday, September 2, 2021

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2021 to qualify for school enrollment in September 2021. No exceptions.
