Parking at NGE

As a school community that is growing, we are all experiencing the difficulties that come with a lack of parking spaces in the morning. This is just a reminder that the school parking lot is for NGE staff only.

In addition to Snowsell parking the Okanagan Jewish Community Centre, across the street from the school, has graciously offered to let NGE families use all but 3 of their available parking spots during the busy before and after school times. Drop Zone Program

We are now entering our sixth year of our Drop Zone. This system has provided safer traffic conditions and improved traffic flow during the peak periods of school entry (i.e. from 8:10-8:30am).

Reminders for those new to the system:

- Cones are placed along the outside of the drop-off zone (to ensure that vehicles only enter and exit at the ends of the lane)
- Vehicles must pull up as <u>far forward as possible</u> when entering the drop-off zone in order not to back up traffic on Snowsell St.
- Parents must stay in their vehicles (if you need to get out, please use a parking spot along Snowsell St.)
- Children must exit out of the right side of the vehicle to avoid unsafe parking lot traffic

In order to continue our success with this program, we need of more parent volunteers. Even helping out once every 2 weeks makes a huge difference! If you can help our team out, please contact the school and let us know.



Traffic Concerns

The City, School District #23, and the RCMP continue to consult on the traffic

concerns around our school. Of particular concern is the intersection of Snowsell and Union, which is especially tricky during winter weather. Winter Walking Safety Tips

Since the start of the new year there has been a rash of injuries caused by slipping on ice. Check out the <u>top ten tips</u> for staying upright during the winter season. Tip #7 *Appropriate Footwear* requires a bit more explanation. Not all winter footwear comes with anti-slip soles. As a result many are under a false sense of security when they don their winter footwear.

What can you do to check if a shoe has slip resistant soles? Here are some ways to check:

- Is the treaded design fine? Or are there larger lugs? Usually, the smaller the lugs, the better the slip resistance.
- Feel the sole. Is it soft and pliable? Usually, the softer the sole, the better the grip.
- Soles are made with various compounds such as rubber, PVC, polyurethane, etc. Rubber has the best slip resistant qualities.
- A large footprint is better

Canadian Curling Association recommends a sole made of "a pebbled type of rubber or those made of a soft crepe-like rubber". If it's good enough for the Canadian Curling Association...

Some recognizable brands include <u>jstep</u> and <u>CrewGuard</u>. Icy conditions are a fact of life in Canada. Ensuring your footwear matches the environmental conditions will help you from falling victim to slippery conditions.

ONLINE APPLICATION for STUDENT ENROLLMENT

2021 - 2022 School Year (for kindergarten, new students, and Programs of Choice for K – 12)

Online applications begin on Monday, February 1, 2021 at 7:00 am,

Schools will be open at 7:00 am to provide telephone support to parents that require assistance.

Documentation Submission Deadline: Friday, March 12, 2021

HOW TO APPLY

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Please contact your school and they will assist you with the online application.

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only, no paper enrollment is available. You are required to have a valid email account.

Applications will be assigned a date-time stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school by email by Friday, March 12, 2021.

- Birth certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- Proof of B.C. Residency
 - a. BC driver's license of parent/legal guardian AND
 - BC CARE card of parent/legal guardian OR
 - c. Other supporting documentation http://www.sd23.bc.ca/DistrictInfo/schoolenrollment/
- 3. Proof of Student's Living Address
 - a. Property ownership, lease or rental agreement OR recent utility bill

AFTER Thursday, September 2, 2021

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will be notified by a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

New out-of-catchment area enrollments: Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2021 to qualify for school enrollment in September 2021. No exceptions.

Dear Parents/Guardians and School Community:

The Ministry of Education passed Bill 36, the School Amendment Act, which eliminated the Standard School Calendar. As a result, school districts are now required to establish their own school calendars. The calendar committee is comprised of representatives of the partner groups in the Central Okanagan Public Schools including the Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (C.O.T.A.), Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 3523 (C.U.P.E.), Central Okanagan Principals and Vice Principals' Association (COPVPA), and the Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council (COPAC). This committee has met to draft a proposed school calendar (attached), which meets the requirements of Bill 36.

Section 87.01 (7) of the School act requires consultation on school calendars. A board must make public a proposed school calendar one month before submitting it to the Ministry. We are inviting the community to review the proposed calendar for the 2021/2022 school year and to provide input to the proposal before it is discussed by our Board of Education at a public meeting.

I invite you to provide your input about this proposal by Friday, February 19, 2021 by completing a very brief survey at the link below:

We anticipate that the finalized 2021/2022 school calendar (once approved by the Board of Education) will be provided to parents early this spring. A copy will be provided directly to you through your child's school.
